



MOST VALUABLE PROMOTIONS' MVPW-03 POST-FIGHT PRESS CONFERENCE QUOTES AND PHOTOS

EL PASO, TEXAS – MAY 30, 2026 – Most Valuable Promotions' (MVP) historic MVPW-03 took place on Saturday, May 30, at the El Paso County Coliseum in El Paso, Texas, and streamed live on ESPN and ESPN+, delivering a stacked night of championship action and becoming the highest-grossing combat sports event in the venue's history. Headlined by hometown hero and MVP's WBA lightweight world champion **Stephanie Han** (14-0, 3 KOs), who retained her world title and undefeated record with a hard-fought majority decision victory over the greatest two-sport athlete of all time **Holly Holm** (34-4-3, 9 KOs), the event also set the stage for a potential undisputed showdown at lightweight as MVP's reigning WBC and WBO world champion Caroline Dubois made a surprise appearance at the post-fight press conference to challenge Han following her victory. The event also featured a historic performance from MVP's unified featherweight world champion **Amanda "The Real Deal" Serrano** (49-4-1, 32 KOs), who stopped mandatory challenger **Cheyenne Hanson** (17-3, 13 KOs) in the second round to retain her WBA, WBO, and Ring Magazine featherweight world titles and tie Christy Martin's all-time women's boxing knockout record with 32 career KOs. Additional standout performances included MVP's unified IBF and WBO middleweight world champion **Desley Robinson** (12-3, 4 KOs) successfully defending her world titles and earning MVP's \$20,000 Performance of the Night bonus and WBC junior flyweight world champion **Lourdes Juarez** (40-4, 5 KOs) retaining her title in a thrilling clash with MVP's three-division champion **Yokasta Valle** (34-4, 10 KOs).

STEPHANIE HAN QUOTES

On Holm's performance compared to their first bout:

"I think I did enough to win. Holly [Holm] definitely made her adjustments, and she was better. It was definitely a closer fight, but I felt that I was in control and that I had this fight."

On her post-fight thoughts on her bout vs. Holm:

“I feel like Holly [Holm] is a competitor. She’s a champion for a reason. I’m proud of my performance, and I did enough to win. I’m so glad that it was in El Paso. It was an amazing night of boxing.”

On the public’s response that Holm should have won the fight:

“It was a close fight, but I did enough to win.”

On her hometown crowd at MVPW-03:

“This was definitely the highlight of my life. Fighting in El Paso with the energy. In the first two rounds, I couldn’t even think. I couldn’t even process. I could just hear the screaming, the yelling, and the cheering.”

On selling out the El Paso County Coliseum:

“I love my city. Born and raised. I’m proud to be from El Paso, and I’m so glad that everyone showed up. It’s this whole fight week. From the media workouts, from the press conference, from the weigh-ins. It was packed.”

On fighting in El Paso, TX vs. Holm live on ESPN:

“I never thought I would ever have this moment, and I did. I’m so proud to be from El Paso.”

On highlighting El Paso, TX on ESPN:

“This is historic for El Paso. I don’t think El Paso has ever had this type of fight, this type of card. Four world title fights, including Amanda Serrano. It’s amazing.”

On agreeing to Caroline Dubois’ offer to fight:

“Caroline Dubois, I want to fight you. I want to fight champions. You are holding two of the belts, and obviously, our goal is to become undisputed.”

On wanting to fight Katie Taylor:

“I would love the opportunity. So, Katie Taylor, if you give me the opportunity, I would love to go to Ireland and fight you.”

HOLLY HOLM QUOTES**On feeling she did enough to win the bout vs. Han:**

“When you have a win, more options. When you have a loss, not as many, and that’s what’s frustrating. And it’s easy for them [the judges] to go home and sleep at night, but every fight you put so much into, and when it comes out like that... if I didn’t feel like I did enough, I wouldn’t be saying that. I feel I won the fight.”

On whether she feels there would be a different result if the fight were in her hometown of Albuquerque, NM:

“Not even Albuquerque, just put it on a neutral ground. I don’t need it to be in my hometown. I think the majority of people saw what I felt. So, it’s not like I felt like it needed to be my backyard to be a win because I don’t want to win because it’s in my backyard. I want to win because it was fair. And you know, if that’s what persuaded them, it’s a problem.”

On her respect for Han:

“The respect for Stephanie doesn’t reflect anything with how I feel about the decision of the fight. You can respect a fighter and not agree with the decision.”

On if she’d do a trilogy match vs. Han:

“I guess I’d have to think about that one.”

On her frustration with the judges' scorecards:

“Here’s what’s frustrating about it. A lot of these judges haven’t fought before, and you leave a piece of yourself in there every time, and then it’s just up to them to take it away from you if they want.”

On the cut on Han in their first bout:

“The cut in the last fight I do feel was not worth calling a fight over. I’ve seen a lot of bigger cuts. She fought with a cut tonight that probably bled more than the one from the last fight. So, there are frustrations I have from both fights, but in the first fight, I should have been doing better. I’m more looking into myself. This fight, I felt I performed better, so that’s the difference.”

On wanting to fight Katie Taylor:

“I still want the call out the best, because I feel I won the fight. So, I still want to fight the Katie Taylor. I still want the big fight. Hopefully, I can still make that happen.”

On pursuing opportunities in MMA and boxing:

“I’m open to anything because I love both sports. I want a big fight. I felt like I did enough tonight to warrant that.”

On her love for her fans:

“The fans I have, I’m so thankful. They’ve been around for over two decades... honestly. Especially from Albuquerque. I have a lot of love from them. I wouldn’t have a career without them, so I’m thankful.”

AMANDA SERRANO QUOTES

On tying Christy Martin’s all-time women’s boxing KO record with 32 career KOs:

“That record, Christy Martin had for over 21 years, and to tie it is truly an honor. Christy Martin is a pioneer in this sport, so no disrespect to Christy, but I had to break it, my love.”

On winning her bout vs. Hanson:

"I knew it was going to come. I train hard. I feel like I had the harder, stronger punches throughout the camp, that's what we were training for, keeping our distance and making sure I hit her hard."

On having the only KO of the night:

"All these fights were incredible. I think mine was the only KO, so there were very competitive fights."

On speaking with the referee during the bout:

"Once the referee said, 'You've got to show me something,' that's when I went a little crazy. I told myself, 'It's over. I've got this.'"

On speaking to her corner during the bout:

"The first round, I was just feeling her out. When I got back to the corner, I said, 'That one I was just feeling her out, but I've got it. I've got it.' Then the second round it was over."

On MVPW-03's all-female main card:

"I have to say, hands down, that this was one of the best shows that we've had. All the women, they came to fight, they came to show. They know where they were at, the platform they were given on ESPN and ESPN+."

On her thoughts on Han vs. Holm 2:

"I'm so proud of Stephanie. She came to her hometown and did what she had to do, but Holly, at her age, she looks amazing as well. I'm like, where does she get this energy from?"

On being a part of MVPW:

"I am so proud and so honored to be a part of MVPW. Women's boxing, women's sports in general, it keeps growing and getting better and better. It takes people like MVP to showcase this, to showcase us, and a lot of the audience who support and who watch."

On Hanson blowing gum in her face during their weigh-in face-off:

"It bothered me, but it didn't get really under my skin. Exactly like I told her there, I said you're going to pay for this, and look. She paid for it. Like I said, the last person who did that to me, the fight ended in the second round, and the same thing here."

On taking a pay cut to fight as the co-main event on MVPW-03 in El Paso, TX:

"To me, it wasn't considered a step back. For me, I'm so for empowering women, I would never dim someone else's light for mine to shine brighter. This is Stephanie's hometown. She deserves to be here. She is the champion, and she did for me in Puerto Rico in January, so I said I want to do that for you, and I made sure that I was on this card."

On her time spent in El Paso, TX:

“Coming to El Paso, I didn’t know I had so many fans here. The crowd was amazing. El Paso welcomed me with open arms. It was a beautiful night to share this with Stephanie, and it was an honor to fight here in El Paso.”

DESLEY ROBINSON QUOTES:**On getting MVP’s performance of the night bonus of \$20,000:**

“Awesome. Thank you so much! Crazy. I’m gonna buy a handbag.”

On facing Spencer:

“Credit to Mary [Spencer]. It was a tough fight. It was really good. We knew she was going to be strong, but I feel we executed it quite well.”

On her technique facing Spencer:

“What got it over the line was obviously a fast jab. She walked into that. I was a lot quicker. And I did land a few heavy shots on her as well, which sort of made her stop in her tracks a little bit.”

On feeling sick before her bout vs. Spencer:

“When I arrived here, I was sick. I had tonsillitis. When I got off the plane I didn’t feel okay, so I’ve been battling that the last few days. Just really hard to breathe. To me, I felt I wasn’t 100% purely because I was sick, but like we do, we push through.”

On her plans to improve for future bouts:

“A win is a win. I think we are our own worst critics. I will go back to the drawing board and see what I can do better.”

On training hard to prepare for the fight:

“We trained really, really hard in the camp. Fitness-wise I’m the fittest and strongest I’ve ever felt. I felt so good... until I got sick when I landed here.”

On being a part of MVPW-03:

“As a woman and a mum of three, it’s what dreams are made of. Without MVP, the dream wouldn’t come true.”

On future opponents:

“I think I’ve got a reputation for fighting whoever is in front of me. I’ve never backed down from a fight, and I’m happy to fight anyone anywhere. We’ll see what happens.”

On fighting in El Paso, TX:

“There’s just so much support here. I think it was just a great fight night. The crowd was so welcoming. We got swamped with photos. We feel we’re the real deal. It’s good.”

On her plan to retain her title:

“I was doing everything we worked on in the gym. Intelligence and having a big heart, like I always say.”

On her strategy to face Valle:

“There were a lot of problems with Yokasta’s head. The plan was to work coming forwards and work going backwards. And also moving side to side.”

On the atmosphere during the fight:

“I’m really appreciative of everyone, especially with all the Mexicans who came, and even those who aren’t Mexican. I felt everyone’s support.”

On her prediction that she would defeat Valle coming true:

“I always envision having my hand raised. I did the work, and it happened.”

On wanting to unify at light flyweight and face Evelyn Bermúdez:

“Hopefully they’ll give me a shot at Evelyn Bermúdez, so I can unify the belts.”

MVP has led boxing’s evolution in the streaming era through partnerships with the world’s leading platforms. In November 2024, MVP’s Jake Paul vs. Mike Tyson and Katie Taylor vs. Amanda Serrano 2 was the first-ever live professional sports event streamed on Netflix. Paul vs. Tyson shattered records, becoming the most-streamed sporting event of all time with 125 million live viewers worldwide. MVP went on to partner with Netflix twice in 2025 for MVP’s Taylor vs. Serrano 3 and Jake vs. Joshua: Judgment Day.

Their 2025 trilogy on Netflix topped an all-women's megacard that set the official GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS™ title for the most world championship belts ever contested on a single fight card, male or female, with 17 world titles, earning nearly 6 million viewers globally.
