FROM KASEYA CENTER IN MIAMI, FLORIDA,
LIVE GLOBALLY ONLY ON NETFLIX**

MIAMI, FL – December 19, 2025 – Most Valuable Promotions and Netflix delivered a historic night of boxing at Kaseya Center in Miami, Florida, at Jake vs. Joshua: Judgment Day, setting a new record as the highest-grossing boxing gate in the arena's history. The event streamed live globally, only on Netflix, at no additional cost to its 300+ million members.

In the main event, Most Valuable Promotions' The Problem Child, **Jake "El Gallo de Dorado" Paul** (12-2, 7 KOs) faced his toughest test to date as he stepped into the ring against two-time unified heavyweight world champion and Olympic gold medalist **Anthony "AJ" Joshua** (29-4, 25 KOs). Contested as a sanctioned professional heavyweight bout over 8, three-minute rounds with 10-ounce gloves, the fight delivered a historic moment for the sport, drawing massive global attention as Paul continued his evolution on boxing's biggest stage against one of the most accomplished boxers of the modern era. Joshua set the tone early. The pressure continued in the middle rounds, as Joshua dropped Paul in the fourth, fifth, and sixth rounds, showcasing his overwhelming power. After a valiant effort from Paul, Joshua sealed the victory with a sixth-round knockout at 1:31.

The fight attracted a star-studded ringside audience including Rick Ross, Benny Safdie, Bert Kreischer, Dave Portnoy, Young Thug, Ryan Serhant, Trippie Red, Teshashi 69, Ty Dolla \$ign, Timbaland, Matt Rife, Rory McIlroy, Brandon Marshall, Michael Irvin, Juan Soto, Kay Adams, Shaggy, Antonio Tarver, Rolando Romero, Paulie Malignaggi and MVP's Shadasia Green, Lucas Bahdi, and Wanna Walton.

In the co-main, MVP's undisputed super featherweight world champion **Alycia "The Bomb" Baumgardner** (17-1, 7 KOs) delivered a dominant performance to retain her unified WBA, WBO, and IBF world titles at 130lbs against Canada's #2 IBF, #3 WBO and WBA contender **Leila Beaudoin** (13-2, 2 KOs). Contested under 12 three-minute rounds, equal to the men's championship standard, Baumgardner controlled the action from start to finish, knocking down Beaudoin in the third minute of the 7th round, showcasing the importance of 3 minute rounds in women's boxing. After 12 rounds, the bout went to the cards with Baumgardner earning a unanimous decision victory (117-110x2, 118-109).

Also on the main card, the greatest MMA fighter of all time and Brazilian legend **Anderson "The Spider" Silva** (4-2, 3 KOs boxing, 34-11, 22 KOs MMA) made a spectacular return to combat sports with a statement victory over American MMA champion and combat sports icon **Tyron Woodley** (0-3 boxing, 19-7-1, 7 KOs MMA). Silva stopped the bout at 1:33 of the second round, earning a TKO victory and reinforcing his legacy as an all-time great across both MMA and boxing. In a post-fight interview with renowned combat sports journalist Ariel Helwani, Silva called out Chris Weidman, signaling his intent to showcase what UFC fighters are capable of inside the boxing ring.

Opening the main card, MVP's US Olympian, amateur world champion, and 10x US amateur national champion **Jahmal Harvey** (2-0, 1 KO) stepped onto the global stage to take on prospect **Kevin Cervantes** (5-1, 5 KOs) in a 6-round super featherweight bout contested at 130lbs, designed to showcase two of the division's most promising rising talents. In just his second professional appearance, Harvey showcased his speed and skill with lightning-quick flurries throughout the contest, controlling the action from start to finish. After six rounds, Harvey earned a unanimous decision victory (60-53 x3), handing Cervantes the first loss of his professional career.

In the preliminary card headliner, MVP's and Australia's undisputed bantamweight world champion **Cherneka "Sugar Neekz" Johnson** (19-2, 8 KOs) successfully defended her WBO, WBA, WBC, and IBF world titles at 118lbs against challenger MVP's and Canada's #4 IBF and #5 WBA contender **Amanda "Bambola" Galle** (12-1-1, 1 KO). Johnson showcased her poise and championship pedigree throughout the hard fought bout, earning a dominant unanimous decision victory (98-92, 99-91, 97-93) over Galle. The bout earned Johnson and Galle the MVP Performance of the Night bonus.

Also on the preliminary card, MVP recent signee and Britain's undefeated WBC lightweight world champion and 2020 Olympian **"Sweet" Caroline Dubois** (12-0-1, 5 KOs) made her promotional

debut and third WBC lightweight world title defense in a 10-round bout at 135lbs against Italy's **Camilla Panatta** (8-3-1, 1 KO). In her first fight outside of the UK, Dubois dominated the contest from the opening bell, dropping Panatta in the sixth round. After 10 full rounds, the bout went to the cards with Dubois securing an unanimous decision (99-90x3) win over Panatta.

MVP's Costa Rican star **Yokasta Valle** (34-3, 10 KOs) made her promotional debut with a statement performance on the preliminary card, defending her WBC strawweight world title against **Yadira "La Reina" Bustillos** (11-2, 2 KOs) in a 10-round women's championship bout at 105lbs. Valle emerged victorious via majority decision (98-92, 95-95, 97-93) after 10 competitive rounds, reinforcing her position atop the strawweight division.

MVP's top contender **Avious "Tha Underdog" Griffin** (18-1, 17 KOs) made a powerful statement in the preliminary rounds, earning a devastating first round knockout at 2:59 over Salinas, California's **Justin "Stallion" Cardona** (10-2, 5 KOs) in their 8-round welterweight bout at 147lbs, further establishing himself as one of the most powerful professional boxers in the welterweight division.

Opening the preliminary card, MVP's two-time Brazilian Olympian **Keno Marley** (1-0) defeated American **Diarra "Gift" Davis Jr** (2-2, 1 KO) by unanimous decision (40-35x3) after going the distance in his highly anticipated 4-round cruiserweight professional debut at 200lbs.

Co-founder Nakisa Bidarian was an executive producer of Paul vs. Tyson and the historic Triller Presents Mike Tyson v. Roy Jones Jr., which was the 8th most bought pay-per-view event in history.
